MI Black Mama Bail Out began this week and will run through the middle of June. MUUSJN has been working with Michigan Liberation for 5 years now to End Cash Bail and to bring Black Mamas home for Mothers Day!

The number of UU congregations, as well as the level of involvement keeps growing! This makes me so proud to be a UU, MI Liberation definitely sees our denomination as strong supporters of their work, and an important part of the team!!

We currently have 4 congregations engaged with the Core Team! Many congregations have had special services or presentations, some have had successful fundraisers and plate collections, and BUC did a web event with a lawyer from Detroit Justice Center! about the impacts of Cash Bail. Be Bold Against Bail



Each night, 8,000 people in Michigan spend the night locked behind bars awaiting trial, because they cannot afford bail. And yet those with money are able to go home, and continue to work and care for their family until their trial date.

Cash bail is the single biggest driver of incarceration in America. Despite affecting over 400,000 legally innocent people, many are unaware of the function of this multi-billion-dollar industry.

More help is needed to end cash bail, if this is an issue that speaks to your heart and you would like to get more involved. RED DRESS DAY



I'd like to raise up Marie and the UU Church of Farmington for recognizing Red Dress Day this year. Marie hung red dresses in the Social Hall and Rev Karen shared a prayer during service.

Red Dress Day is recognized each May 5, in the U.S. and Canada, to honor the lives of missing and murdered Indigenous Women, Girls and 2 Spirits.

Métis artist Jaime Black helped inspire the red dress movement, which began in Canada. Red dresses are hung often outside or in public places, to represent the pain and loss felt by loved ones and survivors.

If your congregation also recognized this, please let me know- if not, maybe we could start planning for next year, or possibly even have a Red Dress Day before then.
